# from the president

## California Watercolor Association (CWA) Open Board Positions 2017

Elizabeth Andrew once said, "Volunteers do not necessarily have the time; they just have the heart." Such a simple but true observation! We would all rather be painting than attending board meetings, right?! Volunteers run California Watercolor Association and we need volunteers to keep CWA running smoothly.

Eleanor Roosevelt stated, "It is not fair to ask of others what you are not willing to do yourself." That is definitely the case with your CWA board members. Many of the board members have

held the positions they are in for several years and they have held other board positions as well. We not only appreciate all of the work our volunteers do, we salute them for their devotion to CWA.

Regarding board positions, we like to have "Co" directors. A job shared is a job halved! We hold ten board meetings per year, currently in Walnut Creek. If you have a "Co" director that means that the two of you can alternate attending board meetings, so each of you would only attend five meetings each if you so choose between yourselves. We have even started BART bridges for people who would like to be on the board but find the driving a bit difficult. We make arrangements to pick up/drop off at a BART station.

#### The following positions are open for 2017:

The Budget Director: The Budget Director shall be accountable to the Board for all funds of the Association; shall act as a custodian of the Associations' investment accounts, and shall manage the balances of all CWA financial accounts as approved by the Board; shall review bill-paying and record-keeping activity and shall oversee accounts along with the bookkeeper. The Budget Director shall maintain an inventory of all property of every kind and nature of the Association and maintain proper records. In the first quarter of the year, the Budget Director shall provide to the newsletter for publication the annual financial report and approved budget proposal. The Budget Director shall act as Board liaison to the bookkeeper and tax preparer.

**Director of National Exhibition:** The Director of the National Exhibition shall manage the National Exhibition and shall act as board liaison to the National Exhibition Committee. The Director shall select a juror and exhibition site, with concurrence of the Board. The Director is responsible for appointing and managing all exhibition committee members.

Members At-Large: The two members at-large will have no assigned programs. They will provide assistance to the Board on special assignments, will learn the Board's functions, and will serve as liaison between the Board and the general membership. We need one Member At-Large for 2017.



## **California Shows Report**

The California shows had a promising year with two very successful exhibits. "Watermarks" was open only to signature members and was hung in the beautiful Olive Hyde gallery (OHG) in Fremont from July 1 through August 13, 2016. The reception, which was very well attended, was outdoors in the patio on July 9, 2016. Plans for 2017 will make this show open to all CWA members.

The "Water Fall" exhibit was hung at Lindsay Dirkx Brown Gallery (LDBG) from August 30 through September 30, 2016. The opening on September 10 was very well attended. Foot traffic was heavy in the Lindsey Dirkx Brown gallery and we received many compliments on the show. The OHG and LDBG shows could be categorized as regional, where artists from the Bay area and surrounding communities were involved. The regional shows differ from the national shows in smaller scope, and yet offer members an opportunity to engage in a professional level show.

I worked closely with Sue Johnston and Bob Davidson, who directed and managed the Olive Hyde Show. Craig Moline and I directed and managed the Lindsay Dirkx Brown show. Both shows drew a number of entries and many favorable comments about the quality of work.

These two very successful 2016 regional shows were held in quality public galleries. Employees were around to keep an eye on the exhibit and both the organizations are enthusiastic supporters of CWA efforts. We want to keep working with continued on page 7

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LDBG and OHG. We have already committed to working with them next year. We should be able to share confirmation of the 2017 relationships soon.


Originally, we had hoped to have two other local exhibits this year at the John Muir Aspen Surgery Center and the Alameda Library. Unfortunately, we had issues with both sites. We did hear from members in another arts organization about some problems at John Muir. After consideration with our board and some investigative work, we decided we could not recommend the site to our members and could not continue with the show. We regretfully withdrew.

The Alameda Library decided to cancel all of their art exhibits indefinitely, including shows that had been booked for 2016. We received notice of their intention very late and talked with the library leadership several times. We understood the limitations of their commitment to the arts and accepted their decision.

The year has been exciting with some great successes for the regional shows. I believe we learned quite a bit about what we need in a regional show. We need to ensure a variety of perspectives by recruiting acceptance judges from around the country to view the electronic entries. Place award judges need to come in person to view the work once hung. We need active partners, who are enthusiastic about community art, mindful of the care needed for original artwork, and have plentiful foot traffic. In a noteworthy development, we sold two paintings (one at each show). We need to keep celebrating the work of our members in the regional shows. Craig Moline and Michael Friedland will be leading the California shows next year. They will carry the insights from 2016 forward as they work with Lindsay Dirkx Brown and Olive Hyde for 2017.

### **Ann Balch: Mindful Painter**

Ann Balch is a Canadian watercolor and water media painter living and working in New Brunswick, Canada. Ann is recognized as an artist by the many national government agencies and corporations that have purchased her work. She is also a member of the Canadian Society of Painters in Watercolor and Society of Canadian Artists. I wanted to share Ann's work with the CWA newsletter for two reasons.

First, Ann works with watercolor paint that has been impregnated with acrylic paint or coated with an acrylic varnish. A growing number of painters are combining watercolor with other waterbased media. Watercolor painters are integrating watercolor pens, crayons, or pastels into their work. Some artists are using varnish to seal and protect watercolor. Ann has examples of both techniques in her work.

Ann seems to combine qualities of both luminescent watercolor and the solidifying aspects of acrylic. Sunkissed is an example of the technique

Second, some of Ann's paintings feature unique feelings and subjects. Consider Two of a Kind, a gentle, kind and humorous perspective on sheep. The image makes me smile as I admire the virtuoso quality of those wooly curls.

In a second sheep portrait, Ann used watercolor and acrylic varnish. The result is an interesting surface that seems smooth and radiant, and an image that captures a sheep of great presence and character.

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I think the operative word for Ann's paintings is presence. I have a sense of presence in each of these paintings. In addition, as creatures, sheep or lambs have many metaphorical meanings. I went back to look at the portraits again and did some more research on Ann. In a YouTube interview (http://tiny.cc/acgegy), Ann Balch explained that her paintings are all concerned with the presence of God. Looking at Balch's work, I see that almost anything can be a focus for an evocative painting when the intentionality is present.

The hands and flowers carry a narrative also. Something peaceful and meditative comes through in this image.

I cannot tell how much the varnish or acrylic paint makes a difference in the surface of these paintings. I found a YouTube tutorial (http://tiny.cc/4bgegy) on using archival varnish to seal and protect watercolor.

Many of these tutorials are available online. I see artists painting on canvas with watercolor and sealing with archival acrylic varnish. I would like to try the technique. I will let you know how the experiment works. And as always dear reader, your comments and questions are appreciated. Please let me know what you think.
