



## Angel Island State Park

10 am to 1:30 pm, Saturday, August 22, 2015

in San Francisco Bay



Angel Island State Park, the largest island in the San Francisco Bay, offers some of the best views of the surrounding Bay Area, including breathtaking vistas of Marin County, San Francisco, and the Golden Gate Bridge. With great hiking trails and many other recreational opportunities readily available, Angel Island is truly a hidden gem in the midst of the urban Bay Area. Coast Miwok once inhabited the island, and for nearly 100 years—from the Civil War to the Cold War—the federal government used its strategic location for military bases, a quarantine station, and an immigration station. Today, visitors can enjoy the view from the island’s historic sites and facilities.
